A neighbor recently turned to the Northside Neighborhood House for assistance after she and her adult son were faced with increased rent following the sale of their rental unit. The rent nearly tripled, making the monthly expense too much for their budget. While they were fortunate to find a new location at a more affordable rate, the move exhausted their income and savings. After paying their deposit, they were not able to pay their first month's rent. NNH was able to assist, ensuring they remained housed.

The Seventies brought changes to the NNH. While we continued to serve the community with the distribution of food and clothing for families in need, we saw growth in programming as we partnered with other community organizations. The Chattanooga Girls Club

became one of our greatest partners as we collaborated to expand

programming for young girls to five days a week. We also saw the retirement of Mrs. Longgley as executive director, after more than 51 years of service. The board moved to change NNH's name to the Rose S. Longgley Neighborhood House to honor her service.
