On February 14, the Northside Neighborhood House turns 100 and that is something to celebrate! It was on this day in 1924, that Rose Longgley, Emily Page Schlesinger, and a group of women decided they had an obligation to help neighbors



in need. After noticing neighbors without blankets living in substandard housing along the Tennessee River, they took action. Recognizing that bedding was a concern for the mothers trying to keep their children warm, the ladies set out to provide much-needed resources and valuable life skills, teaching the women to sew and quilt as a means to self-sufficiency.

Throughout the years, the NNH has remained committed to listening and responding to the needs of our neighbors. From distributing milk or coal throughout the Great Depression to ensuring neighbors are housed with working utilities in the current economy, our mission has remained the same - to create relationships with and connect neighbors to resources to support their path to stability and opportunity.






#### **Round Up at Elder's to Support** the Northside Neighborhood House

## **Stability Spotlight**

A neighbor recently turned to NNH for food assistance after being out of work for several weeks following surgery. In meeting with the







neighbor, there were many factors impacting her ability to live in stability. A forced relocation of apartments created a rent increase, and a recent divorce impacted income leading to a month's deficit to ensure the family's needs were met.

Following a visit with one of NNH's Case Managers, she was able to make some minor adjustments to her budget and get support in applying for various programs to help reduce monthly food and utility costs moving forward. Additionally, NNH was able to pay for a month's rent keeping the family from homelessness, provide groceries from our food pantry, create a spending plan with her, and provide her with NNH's community job list.

NNH's motto of providing a hand up, not a hand out is lived out daily through this work.
