In 1924, several ladies including Rose Longley and Emily Page Schlesinger noticed neighbors without blankets living in substandard housing in the North Shore community. The ladies recognized that bedding was a concern for mothers who were trying to keep their children warm. As a way to provide much-needed resources and valuable life skills, the women taught sewing and quilting as a means to self-sufficiency.

Quilting laid the foundation of the Northside Neighborhood House 100 years ago. Just like the patterns in the quilts sewn a century ago, there is a beautiful pattern that makes up the Northside Neighborhood House story.

As we celebrate our 100th Anniversary over the course of this year, you will hear stories comprised of neighbors, connections, relationships, and hope. You will see how our work is stitched together to continue the legacy that started so long ago.

While she had secured a job at a local manufacturer, she had to forgo the position when she was assigned to a shift that was not compatible with her twin's child care. Fortunately, she was able to secure a new position at her children's daycare, but wasn't able to start immediately, resulting in her getting behind on her monthly rent.

NNH was able to cover a month's rent as well as provide her the opportunity to participate in Santa's Workshop, where she was able to choose Christmas toys for her children.
